We have developed a new Trust Development Plan 23-24 with clear objectives for the end of the year trying to build on our successes and develop even more successful collaboration projects to benefit our children, staff and leaders.

SHARED LEARNER ACTIVITES



We successfully raised external £55,000 to fund last year's project covering the majority of costs (with a £10k contribution from the Trust account for venue hire) which has provided financial security to continue to grow the programme this year. It enabled children 494 and staff from all 7 schools to benefit from excellence in learning and CPD in Arts.

It provided an opportunity for public presentation of exceptional Artwork which shows pride and value in achievement being shared with the schools' own communities and to the wider public, showcasing and removing stereotypical assumptions.

It has created a school improvement model for Arts CPD especially the use of Artists in residence for the Trust and it has widened career opportunities and aspirations for pupils.


PEER TO PEER REVIEWS
